In early April, the construction crew broke ground on building Pro's new Crop Protection and Seed Shed at the location in Rolfe. The building went up quickly with the walls and rafters being installed about three weeks after construction started. "We want our farmers to be able to fully utilize the assets that this addition can offer to them by next spring," shares Dan Wallace, location leader in Rolfe. Wallace continues, "The goal for the facility is to provide a local agronomy servicing option and price competitive products with top-of-the-line technology".

Another great asset to this facility is the ability to treat seeds in a controlled environment. The building is completely enclosed with easy load out options, is temperature controlled and most importantly, it will keep the seeds (and chemicals) out of the natural elements. A unique feature that Pro is excited for is the opportunity for the farmers to hot load chemicals afterhours and to mix mini bulk loads of chemical. There will wide variety of products in the facility. Between gallon jugs, to bulk chemical options, as well as numerous seed options – Pro can service all the farmer's agronomy needs. The motivation behind building a facility like this at Pro Cooperative, as well as any improvement at the company, is to satisfy Pro's producers and improve efficiency across all scales – this project is no exception.

To better accommodate the members and producers, Pro has expanded their fleet of by adding three new grain dept semi tractors and trailers! One of the driving factors in purchasing these new semis was replacing vehicles that were not as functional or as safe to drive anymore. In early June, Pro Cooperative added three new 2022 Peterbilt 389 series for our grain department! All three of these semi tractors have a Cummins X15 engine with a manual Eaton 13 speed


transmission under the hood; they will retain their value for many years.

AGRONOMY UPDATES

IT'S TIME TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF VARIABLE RATE FERTILIZER THIS FALL



It is more important than ever to be profitable with investing in fertilizer. A variable rate application to a field has the best chance for the crops to soak up the phosphate and potassium nutrients. Typically, variable rate applications utilize the same amount of fertilizer as planned for flat rate. The product is just moved to an area with more need due to higher yields or soil deficiency. If it's been 4 years since the field has been grid sampled, it is time to get it done. With the yields over the past couple years, it is important to know where the soil levels are. Pro's agronomists can also use the past yield's data with the soil data to have a better understanding of the nutrient needs. Yield data can also be used to create variable rate nitrogen maps for NH3 or liquid applications as well.

Be sure to contact a Pro agronomist or call a location to try variable rate Nitrogen or dry fertilizer this fall!

CONSIDER FEEDING CALF CREEP

GRAIN UPDATES

PRO'S EXTENDED PRICE CONTRACTS

Pro Cooperative is the industry leader in grain marketing flexibility for farmers. Pro offers a wide variety of contract types to meet the needs of your individual farm with a team of originators to help you navigate the uncertainty in the marketplace. One contract type to consider is the Extended Price Contract.

The Extended Price contract involves a cash sale at the spot price while simultaneously buying a futures contract in a later month (typically March or July). When you are ready to exit the futures contract, the gains or losses since the entry point are netted against the original cash price for a final cash price less contract fee.

Pros:

- Stop or avoid storage fees
- Maintain penny for penny upside participation on a futures price rally to increase the price of the original cash sale
- Eligible for a cash advance up to 80% of the cash price.

Cons:

- Still have penny for penny downside price risk, if futures prices fall the losses will be deducted from the original cash price, and
- Margin payments required if losses fall below the original 80% cash advance.

Cost: 3c per bushel on corn, 5c per bushel on soybeans.


Greg Ahlrichs explains Pro's new automated grain dryer




