A NOTE FROM PRO'S CEO: TERRY PANBECKER


Happy spring! It is crazy to think we are starting summer in few weeks; it feels like it was just the beginning of planting season! There have been some exciting updates happening at Pro Cooperative since our last newsletter. In this spring edition, we give an update on the new dryer in Pioneer as well as look to see how the Havelock project has been progressing in their construction of their new conveyor, boot pit and two new bins. The picture on the right depicts the progress on the construction as well as loading the most recent train. The Havelock project has come to life over the past 30-60 days with the boot pit being poured and capped, tunnels being placed for underground grain movement as well as the reconstruction of the driveways off to the west of the office to improve logistics and efficiency of traffic flow in and out of Havelock's location.







We have been updating electrical components in the Graettinger location throughout the last few months. One of the projects in Graettinger was updating the electrical panel boxes to waterproof and dustproof cabinets. This will help mitigate risk and increase safety at that location. At the Terril location, the Sinclair fuel station is performing better than projected! We have exceeded the expected gallons utilized at this facility and the team in Terril received a 100% score, a perfect score, following the most recent Sinclair Brand





Also highlighted in this spring newsletter, the Gilmore City Service Center location has a few upgrades, and they also had a great open house to celebrate their reopening – thanks to those who attended to make this event a great success! THANK YOU, TRAIN CREW!

Pro's Havelock location has loaded numerous trains already this calendar year!

Have you wondered what a bird's eye view looks like while we load a train? Take a look at the photos here off to the right and below. The photos depict the train loading process in Havelock. The ones with snow on the ground were taken during our March train and the other two photos were taken at the end of April's train.





A quick rundown to the process of loading a train starts before the train even arrives on site! About a week before the train arrives, between loads of Havelock's incoming grain and location transfers, at least 400,000 bushels of corn gets dumped into Havelock. Once the train arrives on site in Havelock, a team meeting is called to go over safety and

communicate with the team what the game plan is for that train. To start, they first need to open all the lids on the cars and then connect about 10 rail cars to a track mobile (the machine that moves the train cars back and forth to load). Once the cars are in place, they dump grain into the rail cars from the elevator spout. Following the train car being loaded full, then we close the lids and move the rail cars back to the east. All 100+ rail cars are loaded within 15 hours. To put into perspective how large a rail car is, about 4 grain semi loads fit into one rail car!

Loading a train is a crazy, exhausting, and amazing process to be a part of and to watch. It takes all hands on deck to make a train be successful and to have our sole focus in Havelock, we close the Havelock location once the train arrives.

Thank you to all those in charge of making sure Pro's employees stay safe and get the train loaded as quickly as possible.

HAVELOCK'S UPDATE

Pro's Havelock location is making progress on their facility's update!




The Havelock location's expansion project is progressing well! At the beginning of May, the new driveway for inbound grain was completed.

During this process, the construction company also removed the small driveway to the south of the scale house because of lowa DOT regulations. Moving over to the elevator, a hole has been dug for the underground tunnel that connects the two new bins. Currently, they are forming up to pour the floor for that tunnel. The boot pit cap has been poured along with the soil stabilization for the leg tower.

When this expansion project is complete, the Havelock location will add two 800,000+ bushel bins to the facility as well as 6 new topside conveyors and a reclaim conveyor and reclaim leg on the north side of the existing silos in Havelock. When we initially shared the Havelock projects and its expansion, we have since added a receiving pit to the construction plan. This new receiving dump pit will be located on the north side of the tracks, along with the load out and new bins.

AGRONOMY UPDATES

SPRING SOIL SAMPLING

Spring soil sample has many advantages that are attractive to producers in our area! Sampling in the spring time has allowed producers to have more flexibility in both the spring and the fall seasons.

At Pro Cooperative, we promise to provide soil sampling that is done in a timely and accurate matter.



BENEFITS OF SPRING SOIL SAMPLING

- Saves time! It elimates 10 14 days of wait time to spread fall fertilizer.
- Sampling is more consistent in the spring, creating a more accurate sample verses the fall, when it tends to be too wet or too dry for an accurate sample.
- Better core samples are collected when the soil has been tilled the previous fall, rather than sampling right after tillage.
- Focus on the harvest and fall activities verses spring soil sampling.
- Typically, spring has more favorable weather for sampling and gets better as the season progresses.
- Spring has more hours of daylight to be able to sample more days.
- Not as much of a worry of the ground freezing.

Be sure to call your local Pro Cooperative agronomist to schedule your field's spring soil sampling!

NEW TIMPTE TRAILERS:

Whether from the farmer's field, doing a location transfer, or delivering to an end-user, these trailers will help maximize load capacity for each load our drivers are hauling. Although a new company to Pro Cooperative's rollingstock fleet, they are quite similar to the other Pro Cooperative trailers currently on the road. Additionally, they feature electric hopper bottoms, electric tarps, and have an extendable ladder on the back. They will be getting the Pro Cooperative logo placed on the sides of the trailers soon. These trailers have been a great addition to the fleet!

PIONEER'S UPDATE:



We are making progress on our Pioneer Dryer project! As shown in this photo taken last week, most of the parts and pieces of the new dryer have arrived on site. Depicted in the bottom center of the photo, the cement slab for the foundation of the dryer was poured in mid April. Construction has slowed down a little due to the higher wind speeds in the last 10 days, but we still plan to have the project complete mid-summer.

NICE WORK, TERRIL TEAM!



This spring, the Terril team received a 100% score, a perfect score, at the most recent Sinclair Brand Excellence Site Inspection. The objective of the Sinclair Brand Excellence program is to ensure optimum retail sales conditions by continuously monitoring site image standards and customer service experiences. Some of the things Sinclair inspects while they visit include the cleaniness of the facility, good display of the Sinclair branded equipment and overall experience while visiting the facility.

MILFORD LOCATION'S ANNOUNCEMENT:

Pro Cooperative's Milford location is now safer and more efficient after installing a bottom side truck loading system. The upgrade has been a game changer, according to facility Manager Dale Garber. The old top fill system required truckers to climb on top of their trucks to fill. The new bottom load system allows drivers to load product through the bottom valves with an overfill prevention system.

Pro Cooperative's Milford location is a soy biodiesel handling facility that plays an important role in adding value to our local soybean crop. Biodiesel is a clean burning, renewable fuel source that reduces carbon emissions, increases lubricity for extended engine life, and increases cetane for better ignition.



Today, Milford's business consists of buying 99.9% biodiesel from local soybean processors and allowing customers to make customized bio blends, most commonly B5, B11, and B20. Blended loads of biodiesel from Pro's Milford location are sold to Pro Cooperative end users (farmers, truckers, etc) as well as many fuel retailers across Northwest lowa.

Garber shares that the Milford facility now sees about 9 semi-trucks per day moving biodiesel into or out of the facility. On average, the Milford facility pumps over a million gallons throughout the year.

The Milford location joined Pro as part of the merger between Pro Cooperative and Farmers' Cooperative. It was originally constructed in 2002 to help mitigate and capitalize on the 'waste' of crushed soybeans in the area. The 'waste' of the soybeans was soybean oil, the main component of biodiesel.

Garber said constructing the original facility was a necessary but risky business move. "We were the 3rd facility in the state of lowa to produce biodiesel commercially. We were mentored by many professors and engineers at lowa State when we started. Manufacturing biodiesel was slow with small margins, so we stopped creating our own biodiesel just shy of 4 years after we opened the facility and then just switched to 100% transport loads."

Pro's Board of Directors approved the Milford upgrade in the fall of 2022 and the project finished and was placed in service in March of 2023.





PRO HELPS THE LOCAL COMMUNITIES



In late March, the Estherville FFA Chapter held their 2023 Annual Banquet to celebrate the year's accomplishments. Pro's Gracie Vatthauer attended their Banquet and received a certificate on behalf of Pro Cooperative's assistance in the new Estherville FFA Agricultural Learning Center that is being built this summer in Estherville. The facility will include a livestock shed and a fenced-in pasture area for ELC students and Estherville FFA members to further their learning with more hands-on education.
