PRO'S NEW GRAIN ORIGINATOR: CLINTON PAVELKO

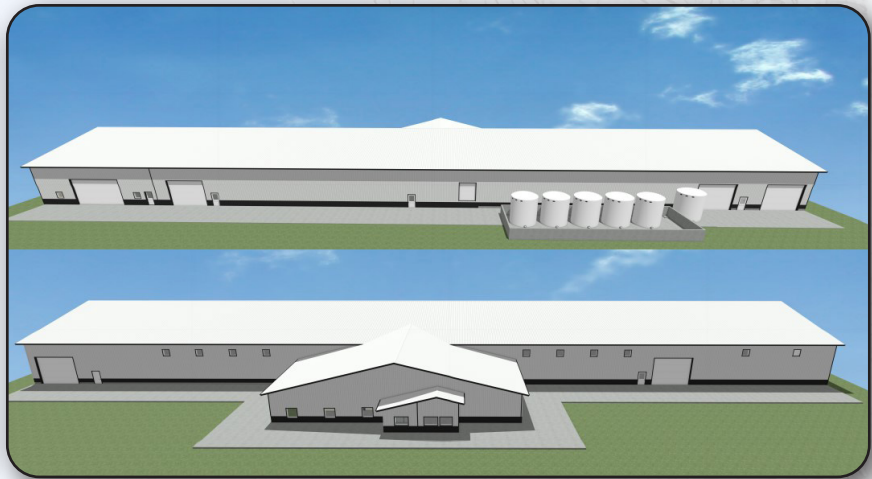

TERRIL'S NEW SEED + LIQUID FERTILIZER WAREHOUSE AND OFFICE

The landscape in Terril has significantly changed this past month! As of Friday, Dec. 29. 2023, all the walls and rafters are up in the shop, agronomy center, load out bays and warehouse. The office's walls and rafters are done. The concrete has finished being poured for the winter, but the finishing touches will be poured around the building in the spring. Currently, the construction team is working to enclose the liquid side. When the plumbing and piping crew arrives, they will start setting tanks and plumbing the liquid side in anticipation to be ready for spring and summer agronomy. Additionally, the UAN tank is about 70% done. With the beautiful weather so far this winter, we can very proudly say that this project, minus the office area, is currently on schedule to be complete by our spring agronomy season.

Pro Cooperative is building a seed + chemical warehouse with liquid fertilizer mixing and a new office at the Terril location. The facility will have three load-out bays for producers to load their agronomy products, including one 24-hour. This facility upgrade will offer more storage for agronomy products, can mix liquid fertilizer batches for the farmers in minutes, in addition, treat and sell seed in bulk quantities. GRAETTINGER'S NEW 800,000-BUSHEL GRAIN BIN AND ACCESSORIES



Pro Cooperative's Graettinger project is gaining some momentum! Mother nature has been cooperating with our construction crew and we are moving along! As of Friday, Dec. 29, 2023, the concrete footings for the receiving pit and the boot pit have been poured. In the picture above, you can see the crew just recently formed up and poured the walls as of Jan. 26, 2024. The construction will slow down now that there is snow on the ground. Everything for this project is on track to be completed and ready for the 2024 harvest!

The Graettinger location will be constructing a new 800,000-bushel bin. Along with the new bin, in addition to a new 25,000 bushel per hour receiving pit and leg and a new overhead conveyor system attaching to the bins. Furthermore, the project also includes a new inbound scale and grain probe to help maximize the location's traffic flow in Graettinger. ENERGY UPDATES

Pro is improving refined fuel delivery discounts starting on February 1, 2024

WHAT IS CHANGING?

We are lowering the starting quantity of our volume discounts. Discounts will now begin at 800 gallons delivered compared to 1500 gallons before. We are also increasing the size of the discounts. Discounts topped out at 5-cents per gallon before and will now extend to 8-cents per gallon.

HOW DOES THIS BENEFIT YOU?

Delivering more gallons per stop means fewer trips and transactions. This reduces our costs, which means lower per gallon prices for you.

WHY THE CHANGE?

Adjusting our discount schedule helps us align our operations with your individual needs. Streamlining our delivery process means more cost savings we can share.

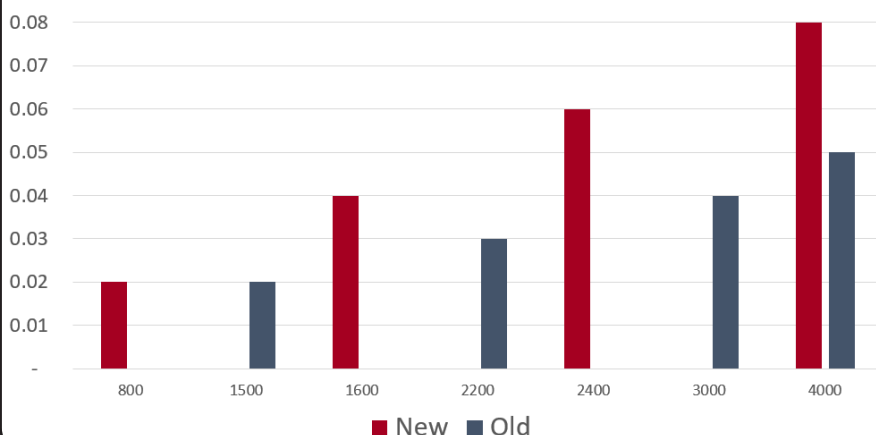
WHAT COUNTS AS A DELIVERY?

A delivery eligible for discount is one product delivered to one address.

EXAMPLES OF NON-QUALIFYING DISCOUNTS:

- Delivering 1000-gallons of diesel and 500-gallons of gas to one acreage.
 - + The diesel is eligible for volume discount,
 - + but the gasoline does not meet the volume discount threshold
- Delivering 500-gallons each in two barrels sitting next to each other at an acreage.
 - + 1000 gallons at one address is eligible for volume discount.
- Delivering 500 gallons of gasoline and 500 gallons of diesel fuel to one acreage.
 - + This is two separate deliveries and not eligible for volume discount.
- Delivering 500-gallons to one acreage and for the same customer driving to another acreage for another 500-gallons of the same product.
 - + This is two separate deliveries and not eligible for a volume discount.

Volume Discount Schedule**

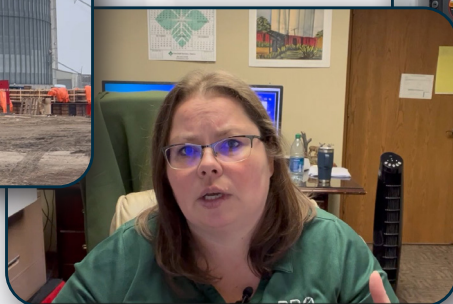

PRO COOP'S 2023 ANNUAL MEETING RECAP:

On December 7, 2023, Pro Cooperative Board of Directors hosted its 2023 Annual meeting.

This meeting was held in Pocahontas, Iowa at the Pocahontas County Expo Center at the Pocahontas County Fairgrounds. All nine current Pro Cooperative Board of Directors were present in person, while about 100 Pro Cooperative members and employees attended the meeting. The Board of Directors successfully conducted an official annual meeting with a proper quorum and parliamentary procedure which was conducted by Jim Shimon, Pro's Board President. Copies of Pro's financial report are located at Pro's Cooperative main office in Pocahontas.

Board election results were announced to our members and board members. Jim Shimon opened the meeting with an update of the capital projects at Pro Cooperative. Then, Todd Glynn, a Certified Public Accountant from Meriwether Wilson and Company, PLLC, shared Pro Cooperative's financial standings. Following Todd's update, Terry Panbecker, Pro Cooperative's CEO, provided an update on how each Pro Cooperative department did in 2023 compared to 2022- financially speaking, and followed that with a discussion on some implementations that will occur at Pro Cooperative to improve the business overall. Carter Peterson was elected and Nick Wiemers and Brady Shelgren were reelected to serve on Pro Cooperative's Board of Directors.

HAVELOCK UPDATE:



Havelock had a WONDERFUL first harvest with the new addition! A slight delay in the harvest season due to rain this past fall actually worked to our advantage, allowing the construction to be completed just in time for Havelock farmers to dump grain into the new addition. Both new bins were filled last fall during the harvest. The receiving pit was a fantastic addition to the project, and the dump speeds ensured that there was no line at the dump pit! Since the start of the new year, Pro has received approval from the railroad to install the overhead bridge between the new bins and the concrete elevator. This will facilitate more train shipments from Pro and enhance the efficiency of commodity switching throughout the year. Havelock added two 800,000+ bushel bins to the facility as well as 6 new topside conveyors and a reclaim conveyor and reclaim leg on the north side of the existing silos in Havelock.
