A NOTE FROM PRO'S CEO: TERRY PANBECKER

Happy New Year! As we close the books on another successful year at Pro Cooperative, I want to take a moment to reflect on the great accomplishments we've achieved together. Over the past year, we completed four major capital projects—each designed to enhance efficiency, accuracy, and safety for both our members and employees. These improvements, highlighted in detail in the previous Pro-Visions newsletter, are now fully operational and serving their intended purpose for members and employees.



As we transition into the 2024-2025 fiscal year, Pro Cooperative's Board of Directors and Leadership Team have chosen to take a purposeful pause on largescale capital projects. While Pro remains in a strong financial position, as shared at our Annual Meeting in December, this year's focus will shift toward targeted upgrades—such as rolling stock improvements and ensuring our facilities continue to meet the highest safety standards.

Reflecting on the past year, we've seen it all—record-breaking heat, extreme temperature swings, powerful winds, droughts, and floods. Agriculture has always required resilience, and at Pro Cooperative, we remain committed to supporting our producers through these challenges. One program that has proven both profitable and beneficial for participating growers is Pro-Tect, powered by Truterra. In its first year, this conservation program returned over \$1 million to enrolled members. Now, as we enter its second year, the opportunity continues. In December, we also launched MyPro, our new online customer service portal designed to make doing business with Pro Cooperative more convenient than ever. With MyPro, members can view and pay statements, access purchase history, eSign contracts, track grain scale tickets, manage agronomy and grain contracts, and much more—all from the palm of your hand. 

ROLLINGSTOCK UPDATE:



This winter, Pro Cooperative expanded its fleet with several new rolling stock additions to enhance efficiency across multiple departments. Pictured on the left is one of three new 2025 International HX520 semi-trucks, marking the first time this model has been introduced to Pro's fleet. Powered by a Cummins engine, two of these trucks will support the feed department, while the third will be dedicated to grain operations. In the middle, the energy department welcomed a 2025 Freightliner 114SD equipped with a Cummins X12 motor. This fuel truck, stationed in Estherville, features a 5-compartment Westmor tank with a 5,600-gallon capacity, ensuring reliable fuel deliveries to members. On the right, the Havelock team received a 2025 Boss MX7 Railroad Trackmobile, designed to improve train-loading operations. Outfitted with a snow-pushing attachment, this powerful machine can now move 20 railcars—doubling the capacity of the previous trackmobile. These investments reflect Pro Cooperative's commitment to providing top-tier service and operational efficiency for our members.



ENERGY UPDATES

Pre-Plant Fuel Storage Maintenance

As you gear up to plant your 2025 crop, don't forget about your fuel tanks. Ensuring your fuel storage is in top condition can prevent costly delays and equipment issues during the busy season.

Risks of Partially Full or Empty Tanks

Many farmers held off filling tanks after harvest, but empty or partially full tanks are prone to water buildup. Fluctuating winter temperatures cause moisture to condense inside the tank, leading to water accumulation at the bottom.





Inspect for Water Before Refueling

Before your next delivery, check for water at the bottom of your tank. Pro Cooperative can assist with inspections and, if needed, work with fuel labs and experts to analyze tank contents.

Why Water is a Problem

Water at the bottom of diesel tanks creates an environment for microbial growth, which can clog filters and damage equipment. Microbes thrive at the waterdiesel interface, feeding on hydrocarbons in the fuel. Contact Pro's Energy Sales Specialist, Ryan Klaassen, for more info: 712-240-0062

Spring Maintenance Checklist:

- Change barrel filters: Prevent contaminants from entering your equipment.
- Clean fuel pump inlet screens: Remove debris that could restrict fuel flow.
- Inspect hoses, nozzles, and caps: Check for wear, leaks, or damage.

An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Taking these proactive steps will protect your fuel, safeguard your equipment, and keep your planting season running smoothly.




